MATCH DETAILS

Day one of 6 round robin games saw the Australian Over 70s team venture to Finchampstead in Berkshire.

After hearty renditions of both the Welsh National Anthem and Advance Australia Fair, Wales won the toss and asked Australia to bat. The team is: Lanigan[c], Bulger, Davis, Drescher, Hardham, Harrison, Preston, Riley, Selby, Southall, Wijeratne and Wilson.



Wijeratne went cheaply LBW. Hardham and Drescher then combined for a 74 run partnership with Hardham making 37 and Drescher 33. The Australian captain Kevin Lanigan came to the crease batting aggressively, but riding his luck, and the score progressed well. The Australians reached 5/167 off 35 overs.

After Lanigan was finally dismissed for a very well compiled 81, solid contributions and partnerships down the order [Harrison 15, Wilson 14 and Selby 19 not out] saw Australia reach 8/237 after 45 overs.

The Wales innings started gradually, and the openers put on 60 for the first wicket. Riley's opening spell was very tight and Southall obtained the first breakthrough. A return catch from the new batsman snaffled by Preston and Wales were 2/60. Preston claimed another, caught by Lanigan at short mid-off, which is followed by another deceptive delivery luring the batsman out of his crease for a smart stumping by Harrison and Preston had three wickets. Wales were 4/91 after 25 overs, then Welsh opener Lawson [50] was run out by a throw from Davis to Harrison. The score was 5/96 at the second drinks break after 30 overs. Soon after drinks Davis disturbed the stumps and Wales slumped to 6/98. Three wickets to Preston and two to left armer Davis broke the back of the Welsh innings.



Wales were dismissed in the final over for 134, with Mike Riley coming back to clean up the tail and finish with tidy figures of 2/11 off 8.2 overs.

A fine innings by Lanigan to lead the Australians to a healthy total, which proved too much for Wales to chase. Next up Canada in two day's time.
