MATCH DETAILS

Well rested after a bye, we travelled just down the road to Farnham Royal for the much-anticipated clash with our Trans-Tasman rivals New Zealand. The team: Lanigan[c], Bennett, Budden, Davis, Drescher, Hardham, Harrison, Preston, Riley, Southall, Wijeratne and Wilson [Lyon fielding 13th man].

After winning the toss and batting, Australia got away to a great start, with a 119-run opening stance with Hardham first dismissed for 55 [75 balls] and his partner Wilson making 58 [71 balls]. With the introduction of the New Zealand leg spinner Wooliscroft a couple of quick wickets and the tables are turned at 4 for 128 in the 27th over.



Some consolidation followed but Harrison stumped for 14 and Lanigan caught for 25 and it was 5 down in the 34th over. Enter Ian Davis who changed the game with a delightful 52 off 30 balls [10 x 4's] and with the loss of the next wicket, Garry Budden put the icing on the cake with a cameo of 38 from 17 balls, including a four and a six in the last 2 balls of the innings.

Australia reached 7/264 after 45 overs, with Wooliscroft the best of the NZ bowlers with 4/34.

Mike Riley broke through in his second over and New Zealand were 1/10. Rex Bennett returning from a knee strain was impressive with 5 overs for 11. A run out of Facoory by Budden to Harrison and a lovely ball bowling NZ captain Guthrie hitting the top of off stump by Southall, and New Zealand were wobbling at 3/55 in the 17th over. Some resistance followed until Wilson [41] was caught by Lyon off Davis. Two further run outs follow by Riley and Davis saw NZ slumping to 6 down for 135 with 10 overs to go.



In the end Wilson came on to claim 2 wickets and NZ reached 9/188. Riley was again tidy with 2/31 of his 9 overs.

A good solid overall performance with the bat and in the field saw Australia worthy winners by 76 runs. A further test awaits on Tuesday against the local English team.
